




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Design of the training in Slovenia

The partnership is already at work planning the next important step of the project: the **3-day training** event to be held in **Ljubljana**, Slovenia, from 25 to 27 November 2025.



The **training** will be attended by **14 adult educators**, 2 from each partner country, who will receive a specific **training** to prepare them for the key role they will play in the **next phases** of the **WIN** project.

Specifically, they will be involved in the **development** of an **adult education neurodiversity training programme**, an employer induction programme to address neurodiversity issues and **create** a more **inclusive work environment**, and a **mentoring programme** for **adult educators** to be able to support employers and persons on the **neurodivergent spectrum** both in entering the **labour market** and in adapting to work in an unfamiliar environment.
